Of the 38,808 graduates in 2018, **35**% or 13,402 **showed no college enrollments within 12 months of graduation**


According to the US Census, approximately **35**% of high school graduates in San Diego and Imperial counties with no college enrollments between ages of 18-19 were active military

- Low SES
- Lower levels of academic preparation & achievement
- Disproportionately persons of color


What are the effects?

- Substantially lower likelihood of college enrollment & completion of four-year degrees
- Negative impact on earnings and earning potential
