D. Brown called the meeting to order at 10:31 am

- 1. Welcome/Introductions
- 2. Approval of May 14, 2021 Minutes

- 4. K-12 to Community College Program Finder Marketing Tools: H. Cavazos presented the K-12 to Community College Program Finder Tool. To begin, she shared the K-12 Community College Program Finder Tool page on myworkforceconnection.org and said that the tool has been publicly launched. The link to the tool is here. Next she shared data updates for the tool. Additionally, she shared promotional flyers and videos for the tool, which can be found on the K-12 Community College Program Finder Tool page. For any edits to the tool, she asked that people email careered@gcccd.edu or heather.cavazos@gcccd.edu. Finally, she noted that there will be upcoming practitioner workshops in fall 2021 for those with interest.
- 5. K-12 SWP Update Regional Director Updates
 - Adv. Manufacturing: R. Chow shared that Palomar College had been approached by Davis
 Technical College in Utah about creating a Composites Technician program. Palomar College
 decided not to pursue this opportunity at this time. If there is interest from other institutions in
 the region, they can reach out to R. Chow for more information.

- Adv. Transportation & Logistics: J. Kropp said that the next Mobilize California Summit is being
 planned. The summit is in partnership with The Green Transportation Summit & Expo and The
 Clean Cities Collaborative. There will be some virtual sessions along with an in-person session in
 Washington.
- Business/Entrepreneurship: J. Patel shared a customer service train-the-trainer opportunity is being planned for September 2021. Anyone with interest can reach out to J. Patel.
- Health: M. Rosas shared that there is an ongoing series trainings for the sector. The topic of the
 first training on June 4th was Novice Manager Leadership Styles: Problem Spotters vs. Problem
 Solvers. The topic of the second training on June 18th is Communication Methods for Highfunctioning Teams in Healthcare. The third is training on June 24th is on Self-care and Wellness:
 Recognize and Prevent Burnout.
- ICT: D. Rinehart said that a cross-sector study with Health, Biotech/Life Science and ICT on the knowledge, skills and abilities (KSAs) required for success is being completed. It is expected that study will be released before the end of June. Additionally, he is working with the statewide Regional Directors and the Statewide Director for ICT to try to reshape the ICT efforts in the state to be more collaborative. He is also encouraging professional development for regional faculty over the summer, so they can be prepared to instruct students on the latest technology and methodology. Also, he is doing research and assisting with curriculum development to support programs where colleges will be applying for ICT grants. Finally, he will be working with K. McMackin to plan for fall 2021 community of practice (CoP) events and with M. Rosas to plan fall discussion forums.
- Life Science/Biotech: K. Wong shared that there were \$1.2 billion in venture capital investments in Biotech in San Diego during quarter one. Significant portions of this investment with to regional partners who offer employment pathways for students in the region. Additionally, there is exploratory research being done on regional biotech programs collaborating with the Department of Defense (DoD) SkillBridge. This program trains veterans as they finish military service and begin civilian careers. Anyone with interest, experience or insight into this program can reach out to K. Wong directly.
