- 3. Fiscal Update: S. Cox provided the following updates:
 - NOVA/reporting: fiscal reports are due. Please contact the Foundation office if you have any spending issues or questions.
 - Round 4 Close-out: in order to avoid a multi-month process, the Foundation will be asking colleges to submit expenses and invoices in late November as part of a 'trial reporting round' to ensure that the colleges are prepared ahead of close-out.
- 4. Early College Credit: A. Perman shared a <u>feedback summary</u> the captures all of the feedback and action items thus far. She also shared that an updated <u>Regional Early College Credit Definitions draft</u> is available for further review and response due by 10.1.21. The next step will be to share this document with ROC on 11.10.21.
- 5. New Proposed Employer Engagement Model: D. Brown and K. McMackin presented on the new proposed employer engagement model. The model will:
 - Create an employer engagement model to improve alignment, coordinate employer engagement and establish regional tracking of KPIs
 - Bring best practices and techniques to all CTE students in the region
 - Increase work-based learning opportunities for students
 - Increase student jobs and employment outcomes
 - Develop and implement approaches that are responsive to employers' immediate training needs
 - Align sectors to the 5 economies (new CCCCO model)
 - Increase connection with COE
 - Create a Regional Employer Engagement Team consisting of:
 - Director of Strategic Partnerships: current Position; manages regional employer engagement model
 - Employer Relations Liaisons (ERL): each college will be assigned a ERL to support employer engagement
 - Industry Relations Consultants (IRC): professional service contracts through regional Strong Workforce; IRCs will focus on regional priority sectors/5 economies

As a next step, the model will be shared with the CEOs on 8.23.21.

6. SWP Advocacy: A. Perman and T. Recalde brought forward the opportunity for the region to compile a list of challenges and pain points experienced with the Chancellor's Office. T. Recalde stated that she

could take this, along with some recommendations on working more effectively, forward as part of her advocacy work with CCCAOE. D Brown also shared that there is an opportunity to share these concerns and recommendations with the CIOs and the CEOs as well.

7. Updates/Reminders

- <u>Contacts for Outreach</u>: L. Wisdom reminded the group to ensure that they have updated their outreach contacts in the google doc.
- WBL Professional Development: K. McMackin shared a <u>WBL Flyer</u> that highlights the
 professional development course that will begin on 10.1.21. The modules include
 Introduction to Work-based Learning, Getting Started with Work-based Learning, and
 Designing a Work-based Learning Lesson. There is an opportunity for ten faulty members
 from each college to attend. The registration deadline is 9.30.21.
- Cyber Hire: K. McMackin reiterated that applications for the Cyber Hire opportunity are open and end on 8.29.21. There are two designations; entry-level cyber security and IT.
- Culturally Relevant Instructional Practice: D. Brown reminded the group that this past spring, the Regional Consortium and the COE hosted two Strong Workforce Faculty Institute add-on trainings focused on Culturally Relevant Instruction and Labor Market Information. She announced that the next offering will be Culturally Relevant Instructional Practice and Leadership.
 - Will be held 10.4.21-10.7.21 (with three reflection sessions to be held in Oct & Nov)
 - Facilitated by UCSD Extension
 - Up to 20 spots per college are available. Priority will be given to Career Education faculty as this being offered through SWP funding
 - R. Chu will send out an email with the flyer and registration link next week
- Credit for Prior Learning/Faculty Recruitment: N. Roe shared that there is a need for college CPL faculty leads. Details include:
 - Fall 2021: Training
 - Attend orientation trainings (1 per month) = \$500 stipend (regional SWP funds)
 - Special topic each month and can invite additional campus representatives
 - Complete Train the Trainer Series (10 hrs) = \$750 stipend (IEPI funds)
 - Additional funds available for assisting with development of trainings
 - Spring 2022 Fall 2022: Implementation of CPL (\$10k per college for equivalent to ~0.20 release)
 - Provide process maps/documentation
 - Faculty review of course for CPL eligibility
 - Student application for CPL
 - Provide data collection plan
 - Provide college baseline data (18/19 20/21)
 - Provide college 21/22 data
- She also announced that the region is looking for attendees to send to the Council for Adult and Experiential Learning (CAEL) Conference being held in San Diego 11.17.21-11.19.21.

The first one will be held in September and will focus on the Basics of Perkins V and Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment. D. Brown will send out a doodle poll with date/time options.
