4. ACUE Presentation: In follow up to T. Ngo Bartel’s presentation last month, K. Middleton presented on the Success and Equity through Effective Teaching microcredential opportunity. The online, asynchronous course is offered in five-modules:

- Managing the Impact of Biases
- Reducing Microaggressions in Learning Environments
- Addressing Imposter Phenomenon and Stereotype Threat
- Creating Inclusive Learning Environments
- Designing Equity-Centered Courses

Up to three Faculty Institute completers from each college will be able to participate in this microcredential course.

5. Comprehensive Training Program Guide: D. Enemark shared that San Diego Workforce Partnership (SDWP) received some philanthropic funding to compile data on all training providers in San Diego County. The goal of the guide is to provide those looking to re-skill or upskill a comprehensive database to training opportunities throughout the county. The guide will be integrated into SDWP’s job seeker tool, My Next Move. More information on the tool can be found at <https://workforce.org/my-next-move/>. To show the high quality of the training programs at the community colleges, SDWP is looking colleges who are interested in collaborating to share their outcomes data. 6. Regional Economic Impact Report: L. Robison shared the final regional report on the economic value of Career and Technical Education at San Diego & Imperial Counties Community Colleges. As a reminder, the Regional Consortium commissioned a regional Career Education economic impact analysis to be completed by Emsi. The purpose of the analysis is to measure the economic activity

generated as a result of the presence of Career Education programs in the SDICCCA colleges. The full project includes an aggregate economic impact study showing the impact of the Career Education programs as a whole, an aggregate investment analysis showing the return on investment to SDICCCA stakeholders, individual economic impact and investment analyses for each of the ten colleges and district reports for SDCCD and GCCCD. All final reports have been shared with each college/district and are available for their use.

7. Bachelor's Degree Exploration Tool: J. Edwards shared information on the USC and UC program finder tool developed by the Orange County COE. The exploratory tool was developed out of need from AB927 which allows for 30 community college baccalaureate degree programs per year. The bill mandates that the colleges do not offer degrees or program curricula that are already being offered at the UCs and CSUs, so this tool will help interested community colleges identify information on those programs. T. Ngo Bartel reminded the group that if colleges wish to move forward with a baccalaureate program, they still need to request an LMI report.
