### What is it?

A Funding Mechanism - with the intent of helping students "defray their educational costs while gaining education-aligned career-related employment."

### **LAEP Overview**

#### Established in the 2021-22 State Budget

The state allocated \$500 million to LAEP

### 98% of eligible public post-secondary institutions are participating

Community Colleges, CSUs, and UCs

**Lead Contacts -** Each participating college signed an agreement within which they identified a LAEP Coordinator who serves as the first point-of-contact for the program for CSAC



### **LAEP Overview**

10-year Program - 2022-23 is the first of the 10-year implementation

- 100% of the funds were allocated in 2022-23
- Funding will roll over and be available until June 30, 2031

**Admin Costs -** Institutions may use up to 5% of allocated funds for the administrative costs of the program



## Student Eligibility

Students must be from an underrepresented background and meet all of the following criteria to be eligible:

- Half-time enrollment
- CA resident classification
- Maintenance of satisfactory academic progress
- Demonstrated financial need
- Eligibility to work in the U.S



## Underrepresented Student Groups

#### LAEP defines "underrepresented" student groups as:

- First generation college students
- Low-income students
- Students who are current or former foster youth
- Homeless students or those at risk of becoming homeless
- Students with disabilities
- Displaced workers

- Students with dependent children
- Formerly incarcerated students
- Undocumented students
- Students meeting the requirements of Assembly Bill 540
- Students who are veterans



### **Student Prioritization**

#### Required Prioritization:

- Students who are
  - First generation college students
  - Current or former foster youth
  - Students who are homeless or at risk of being homeless
- STEM



## **Employer Eligibility**

# Three types of employer entities eligible to employ LAEP students:

- 1. Nonprofit and for-profit employers Nonsectarian, nonpolitical organizations capable of providing full-time employment after graduation or connection to another employer able to provide full-time employment after graduation.
- 2. Public colleges Research centers and institutions operated by public postsecondary educational institutions, if their learning-aligned employment opportunities provide participating students with direct opportunities to participate in the research that is undertaken by the respective research centers and institutions.
- 3. Public schools Public schools operated by school districts, county superintendents of schools, the Department of the Youth Authority, or the Department of Education



## **Employer Eligibility**

#### LAEP funds may provide:

- Up to 90% of the student's compensation for positions at public educational institutions or nonprofit corporations
- Up to 100% of compensation for positions at the UC, CSU, or CCC
- Up to 50% of compensation for positions at for-profit employers



## **Employer Eligibility**

#### Employers must agree to

- Sign an Employer Agreement
- Place students only in an educationally beneficial position that relates to the student's area of study, career objective, or the exploration of career objectives
- Pay the student a comparable rate to that of comparable positions within their organization
- Ensure the position does not displace workers currently employed by the organization
