D. Brown called the meeting to order at 10:30 am

- 1. Welcome/Introductions
- 2. Approval of March 4, 2022 Minutes
 - Motion to approve by C. Storey, second by A. Taccone, unanimously approved.
- 3. Program Recommendations from Deans' Council: A. Taccone announced the following programs were recommended:
 - Imperial Valley
 - Care Of The Elderly For The Health Assistant; NEW; CoA
 - Palomar
 - Dance: Emphasis In World Dance; MODIFICATIONS; CoA & AA
- 4. WDC Chair Election Results: A. Taccone announced that at the Deans' Council, T. Recalde was elected to serve as the WDC Chair through June 2024.
- 5. Introduction of Employer Relations Liaisons: K. McMackin introduced the new Employer Relations Liaisons (ERL) and gave a brief update on their activities so far, which includes an onboarding week and building relationships with internal stakeholders at the colleges. Each ERL then shared about themselves and which college they would be working at. A brief biography of each ERL can be found here.

6. Grant Updates:

- K16 Collaborative: S. Cox informed the group about the K16 Collaborative Grant Program. She noted that if the region's spring 2022 application is not selected, there will be another opportunity to apply in fall 2022. She shared about the grant, the Border Region Inclusive Talent Pipeline agenda, goal and value, and grant activities for K-12, colleges, partner organizations and businesses. The region will likely know the outcome of the application the week of May 16, 2022. If awarded the grant, hiring a small staff for the project will begin immediately for a July 1, 2022 start. - Regional Equity and Recovery Partnership: D. Brown shared that the purpose of this grant is to strengthen the work between the local workforce development boards and the community college regional consortiums. The grant totals \$24M and San Diego Workforce Partnership will be taking the lead. The goal for the grant is to increase the Behavioral Health workforce and will build off of SD City College's Mental Health Work Certificate leading to a Social Work Associate's and Bachelor's Degrees. Six of the region's colleges will be participating along with two universities. The amount of money available and spending restrictions are still unknown. The application for this grant was submitted the week of May 2, 2022. A slide with grant details can be found here.
- US DOL Apprenticeship Building America: D. Brown shared that Palomar is no longer applying for this grant. They were going to be a partner on West Hills Community College's Grant application

but West Hills College decided not to apply. The conversation on apprenticeships in the region is still moving forward. There is a meeting scheduled with representatives from the regional colleges that do have apprenticeships for June 2022 to discuss strategies and supports around apprenticeships.

Strengthening Community Colleges Training: S. Cox shared details about Strengthening
Community Colleges Training grant and its core elements, which includes advancing equity,
accelerated pathways, results-drive project design, and sustainable systems change. The
application for this grant is due June 2, 2022 and can be applied for as a region. The full
