#### **SHAMINI DIAS**

Shamini Dias is a teaching artist and scholar who focuses on equityminded, future-focused, and inclusive teachings that foster successful learning as well as joy and flourishing in classrooms. In research and practice, she integrates learning sciences and liberatory holistic teachings, complexities and systems, and creative methods from contemplative and arts-based processes. Her work includes curriculum and faculty development, working directly with educators to transform

identities and develop intentional equity-minded teaching philosophies and practice across disciplines. She has worked with the Singapore Ministry of Education as an educator at Junior College level and as a teaching artist in the Gifted Education Program, with Open University UK, as well as in community-based arts education in Singapore, Malaysia, and the United States. She is also the Co-Editor of the Steam Journal, a transdisciplinary journal that explores the intersections of Steam and the Arts. Shamini currently directs the Preparing Future Faculty program at Claremont Graduate University in California.





### JOSUE (JOSH) FRANCO, PH.D.

Dr. Josue (Josh) Franco is a first-generation college graduate who holds A.A. degrees in economics and political science from Cerritos College. He also holds a B.A. in public policy, and a M.A. and Ph.D. in political science from the University of California, Merced. Dr. Franco's personal mission is to introduce political science to the next generation of leaders and scholars. He teaches introductory courses in Political Science, U.S. Government and Politics, Comparative Politics, International Relations, California Government

and Politics, and Research Methods. In addition to founding the Civil Grand Jury Lab at Cuyamaca College, Dr. Franco co-authored *Introduction to Political Science Research Methods* (IPSRM) open education resource (OER) textbook, authored *Polimetrics: A Stata Companion to IPSRM* OER workbook, and has a peer-reviewed publication in the *Journal of Political Science Education*. Additionally, he has presented at over a dozen academic and professional conferences. Dr. Franco serves as the Chair of the C-ID Faculty Discipline Review Group for Political Science, a Member of the American Political Science Association's Committee on the Status of First-Generation Higher Education Scholars in the Profession, and a Member of the Western Political Science Association's Standing Committee on Community Colleges. Prior to his academic career, Dr. Franco worked for five years in the California State Capitol and in the U.S. House of Representatives for former Lt. Governor and Congressman John Garamendi.



#### **SHARON SAMPSON**

Sharon Sampson is a professor in the Administration of Justice Department at Grossmont College. She is a key proponent of professional development and acts as the Co-Coordinator at the Office of Professional Development for Grossmont College. The goal of the Office is to provide comprehensive professional learning opportunities for the faculty, staff, and administrators of the college. Sharon also sits on the advisory council for the Convening Taskforce. The Taskforce supports Guided Pathways, an equity-focused and holistically driven approach to the student experience. In addition, Sharon also

participates in the Curriculum Committee to ensure that Grossmont College's curriculum is sound, comprehensive, and responsive to the evolving needs of its students.

For participants' reference, below is the letter of commitment that faculty signed to participate in the Strong Workforce Faculty Institute:

- The project will be collaboratively reviewed and approved by the researcher(s) and CE Dean designated to this project, Regional Chair, and Centers of Excellence for Labor Market Research (COE) Director.
- I understand that if the assignment is not approved, then I will have 30 calendar days to resubmit.
- I will implement the action plan I developed in my assignment after the Faculty Institute (September 2022).
- I will continue to collaborate with the researcher(s) and Career Education Dean to implement the action plan beyond the Faculty Institute (September 2022)."
