Michelle Miller, Area Human Resources Director for Hyatt Hotels, recently partnered with OUSD's Surfside Academy to develop a new hospitality pathway. They developed the first job description unique to Oceanside CTE students, named the Junior Task Force, and a hospitality prep course for students interested in applying.

Surfside students were very excited about the program as Hyatt associates completed two waves of interviews with a third one scheduled. Hyatt's goal is to place Oceanside CTE students in paid internships and offer them the opportunity to shadow hospitality employees as they receive the highest level of hospitality training available. Hyatt hopes to place many of these students in permanent jobs at one of their facilities in the future.


