Valley Center High School Keeping Students Focused on College & Career Readiness



With its FOCUS intervention course, Valley Center has been providing at-risk students with guidance and experiences to keep them on path to graduation. Using the Get Focused Stay Focused! curriculum with the My-10 Year Plan system, students complete individualized experiences to explore and develop college and career readiness skills with a plan that extends beyond high school. Teacher Shandrea Degen engages her students in focused exploration such as researching how college and trade schools align to different professions while learning skills such as budgeting and long-term planning. When asked about her work, a student shared, "I'm learning how to apply for a job and discovering the difference between part time and full time... finding the benefits of certain jobs that can pay for some of my college classes and get me to the career I want." Students in VCHS' FOCUS classes identify their interests, discover careers aligned to those interests, and develop a plan to prepare with ongoing motivation and support to meet their future goals.

Once completed, Encinitas Ballet Academy saw the dress and asked permission to manufacture the design for their next Christmas Show! What an exciting opportunity for students in the Fashion pathway to apply their creative talents and technical skills to a real-world project, while at the same time building a brand within the local dance community! CHS Fashion students are excited to explore this collaboration. Next steps for the project include:

(1) Fashion students provide sketches of the modified dress for ballet, (2) Encinitas Ballet Academy to confirm with their costume shop the ability to manufacture the design, (3) CHS Fashion Program to be listed in the Encinitas Ballet Academy program, (4) Encinitas Ballet could possibly perform at CHS to promote the costume design as well.

Women in STEM

Did you know that only 28% of S.T.E.M. professionals are women? Using K12 Strong Workforce Program funding, GUHSD is working to close the S.T.E.M. gap in Career and Technical Education! On February 2, 2022, GUHSD hosted a free webinar for students and families entitled, "Women in S.T.E.M." The purpose of the webinar was to inspire young women to pursue careers in S.T.E.M. (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics / manufacturing), as well as to educate all students on how to prepare for a career in one of these high wage, high growth fields. The keynote speaker was Michelle Vargas, who works as a quality control engineer for biotech company Pacira Biosciences. In addition, the webinar included a panel discussion of women who have forged successful careers in cybersecurity, construction, manufacturing, and aerospace engineering. Mount Miguel alumni, Janelle Duenas, who now works as an engineer for N.A.S.A.'s Deep Space Network, was one of the featured panelists. Over 110 people attended the event and 236 people from around San Diego county registered! All registrants received a follow-up email with a LINK to the webinar recording, information on GUHSD CTE/S.T.E.M. pathways and additional resources for further exploration.





Women Who Inspire Event: Thermo Fisher Scientific and the Academy of Health Sciences - Clairemont High School

This fall, San Diego Unified College, Career and Technical Education (CCTE) was excited to partner with Biocom and Generation STEAM to bring the "Women Who Inspire" event to the students of the Academy of Health Sciences from Clairemont High School.
