D. Brown called the meeting to order at 10:30 am

- 1. Welcome/Introductions
- 2. Approval of November 13, 2020 Minutes

- 4. The Labor Market Economic Recovery: T. Ngo Bartel shared the process of how the labor market research completed by the Center of Excellence (CoE) is validated by employers. This information is used by the Regional Directors to construct their sector profile and strategy, and to create Request for Applications (RFAs), which allows colleges to apply for funding to help them align their programs to labor market data.
 - Supply Chain & Logistics: J. Kropp presented the sector profile and strategic recommendations
 for the Supply Chain & Logistics sector. He provided a description of the Supply Chain &
 Logistics sector, the methodology behind the sector analysis, and specific recommendations to
 the colleges. T. Ngo Bartel presented regional trends for the Supply Chain & Logistics sector. The

- 5. CCCAOE Update: J. Patel shared that planning has started for the spring 2021 CCCAOE conference, which will be held over the course of three weeks; March 3 -5 , 9 -11, and 16 -18. She informed the group that the call for presentations for the spring conference is due on December 18, 2020. ACTION ITEM: C. Yerkes will email the conference details to WDC.
- 6. Voting Structure: M. Smith shared that there will be changes coming to the WDC voting structure. She noted that D. Brown would introduce the development of the new structure in early 2021. She recommended that the current voting structure disband and the group consider a similar framework to the new voting structure the presidents are developing.
- 7. Professional Development: M. Rosas presented the regional professional development schedule for fall 2020/spring 2021, which is available here. She highlighted the Advanced Manufacturing Discussion Forum on December 16, 2020 and the ICT & Digital Media Discussion Forum on December 18, 2020.
