## A. Taccone called the meeting to order at 10:33 am

- 1. Welcome/Introductions
- 2. Approval of June 12, 2020 Minutes
  - Motion to approve by J. Ayala, second by A. Ortega Jr., unanimously approved.
- 3. Programs approved by the Deans' Council. A. Taccone announced that the following programs were recommended at the Deans' Council meeting.
  - Palomar College
    - o <u>Drafting and Design Technician Creo</u> Certificate of Achievement
    - o Drafting and Design Technician SolidWorks Certificate of Achievement
    - o <u>Drafting and Design Technician AutoCAD</u> Certificate of Achievement

- 4. The Labor Market Economic Recovery: T. Ngo Bartel presented the methodology for recommendations made by the Center of Excellence (CoE) for labor market research of priority and emerging sectors. The labor market research is the source from which the Regional Directors develop their sector profiles and strategies to present to the region.   - Advanced Manufacturing R. Chow shared the sector profile and strategic recommendations for Advanced Manufacturing in San Diego and Imperial Counties. She provided a description of Advanced Manufacturing, the methodology behind the sector analysis, regional trends for the sector, and provided specific recommendations to the colleges.   - ICT Software Development: M. Smith shared that the core purpose of the ICT-Software
    Development RFA is college alignment of curriculum with sector knowledge, skills and abilities
    (KSAs). She said five out of the ten colleges submitted responses to the RFA and said the hope is
    that the other five colleges will align their curriculum as well.
  - Resilient Jobs Study: T. Ngo Bartel presented a draft of the upcoming Resilient Jobs Study. The
    study includes an analysis of two time-periods of economic downturn and the jobs in the region
    that have been resilient during those time-periods. The data is intended to inform the colleges
    and other partners as they make strategic programmatic decisions. The full-report will be
    released at the end of August 2020. The full presentation can be found here.
- 5. Regional SWP Outcomes Presentation: A. Taccone provided newly updated LaunchBoard data regarding 2018-2019 regional Strong Workforce outcomes and metrics. The region demonstrated improvement in the following metrics: Students Earning 9+ Units, Students Who Attained a Noncredit Workforce Milestone, and Students Who Earned a Degree, Certificate, or Apprenticeship Journey Status. - 6. Marketing Survey: M. Ash shared that the COE and regional marketing team deployed a marketing survey to approximately 75 regional stakeholders. To date, 37 responses have been received. Stakeholders have until the end of August to complete the survey. M. Ash noted that this information will be used to help guide future marketing priorities and expenditures.
- 7. 2020-2021 Calendar: M. Ash presented the WDC meeting calendar for 2020-2021. She noted that the October regional meeting, which usually occurs during CCCAOE, is scheduled for October 9, 2020.
