Increase the number of students enrolled in programs leading to high-demand, high-wage jobs.




Improve program quality, as evidenced by program completions, transfer programs, employment and/or earnings improvement.

SWP Fiscal Year 2024-2025*

- \$290,400,000 available to support Strong Workforce Program pursuant to Part 54.5 (commencing with Section 88820) of Division 7 of Title 3 of the Education Code.
- (\$5,000,000) shall be available on a one-time basis to support a statewide education pathways for low-income workers demonstration project, and (\$60,000,000 x 5 years) shall be available to support the Rebuilding Nursing Infrastructure Grant Program.
- SWP Funding Base Allocation Breakdown
 - \$128,478,000 FY 24-25 Local Share Distribution (@60%)
 - \$85,652,000 FY 24-25 Regional Share Distribution (@40%)
- SWP Funding Incentive Allocation
 - Local Shares Reduced by 22.4% (\$27,588,000 ⇒ \$21,413,000)
 - Regional Shares Reduced by 22.4% (\$18,392,000 ⇒ \$14,275,333)
