Mesa College's Impactship Program Supports Underserved Students

Mesa College's Impactship Program (MIP) is a transformative initiative aimed at providing students from underserved backgrounds with essential professional development and hands-on workforce training opportunities. Supported by SDI RC, MIP emphasizes "interning with a purpose," helping students prepare for successful careers through valuable industry experiences, including internships, volunteering, employment, or training. Students in MIP receive financial aid, including stipends or hourly compensation.

SDI RC's support includes funding a work-based learning coordinator at each college who serves as a lead for the program, and an employer relations liaison who is responsible for developing internship opportunities at Mesa. To further enhance MIP, SDI RC also facilitates faculty professional development on work-based learning, ensuring that educators understand the importance of these opportunities for students.
