  - Panel questions:
    - In your experience, which military-acquired skills translate most directly into civilian employment, and which require the most retraining or reframing for employers to recognize their value?
    - How often do you see veterans transitioning into a civilian career directly related to their military occupation? How can we better support the transferability of skills for those transitioning with a career change?
    - o I am interested to hear from the panel about the high turnover rate for military exits. Approximately half of veterans leave their first civilian job within one year, and about 80% leave within two years. How can we as workforce professionals guide them to pathways that can help them find a career that is the right fit for them, so they don't have to job hop? (Chat Question from K. Overklift)
    - Do any of the panel who are working within the education systems find that the
      veterans are frustrated with school/progression of their learning due to the
      differences of civilian attitudes vs those of military personnel. And are those
      attitudes contributing to veterans changing jobs or quitting school after they exit



the military?

- What programs are effective in preparing veterans to enter the civilian workforce? Are there programs in other areas we should consider replicating?
- I am interested in knowing which community colleges are part of Operation Connect? (Chat Question from L. Grob)
- o Have you found it difficult to educate employers about the value of hiring veterans?
- What industry sectors would benefit from this workforce but have not typically hired them?
  - Rachel Miller (she/her), Palomar College: Telecomm seems to have a huge veteran population
  - David Schnepp, MakerSquad: asked if CPL address this issue?
- Ruth Salcido: shared about their San Diego EDD JVSG program team which offers assistance and priority service to veterans, service members, and eligible spouses for job search, training, and career transition through resources like America's Job Center of California (AJCC) locations and CalJOBS.
- Beverly Garcia: The high percentage of veterans that are interested in a career change from their military service reflects our larger population of employees who change careers often 2 or 3 times throughout their work experience. It's good to support veterans and support them if they do want to explore a new career or entrepreneurship.
- **Eusebio Travis Sevilla:** asked if any of the panel who are working within the education systems find that the veterans are frustrated with school/progression of their learning due to the differences of civilian attitudes vs those of military personnel. And are those attitudes contributing to veterans changing jobs or quitting school after they exit the military?

- Jay Wylie: Great points from Jordan and Susan many of the veterans we serve want to do something completely different than their military experience!
- Eusebio Travis Sevilla: EMT/Nursing should have some sort of certification. Especially combat
  medics that are TCCC certified and have dealt with actual traumas way more than a student in a
  classroom.
  - Benjamin Gamboa: shared MiraCosta College awarded CPL in medical assisting courses for a veteran corpsman. It at least gets them moving along the nursing pathway.
