We proudly serve nearly **100,000 people** each year and have a regional economic impact exceeding **\$200 million**.





PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS



2024 Community Investments





\$1.2M paid in emergency assistance for 132 households in Vista



\$2.1M in tax refunds returned to 2,282 households through the VITA Program



\$552K incentives and rebates secured through electric vehicle access program



2,133 households received **\$1.7M** in utility bill payment assistance



\$1.75M in weatherized home equipment upgrades for 941 homes, saving ~18% on heat and 7% on electricity annually



\$6,580 savings in fees and loan interest by lending circle participants



\$520K in tuition & program support for 248 in Next Level Workforce Programs & Unidos in Finance



\$1.1M in food distributed to **17,802** families



256 individuals participated in MAAC's Financial **Empowerment Network**
