## **Program Viability Guidance and Program Discontinuance**

### **Reminders**

- Program discontinuance is a faculty-driven process. Faculty leads initiated the request for
  discontinuance during department and college curriculum committee meetings. Their request triggered
  a formal process for program discontinuance led by a workgroup with membership from Instruction and
  Student Services.
- Faculty leads participated in focused meetings to explore and evaluate the impact of program discontinuance on students.
- The CTE Research Expert provided outcomes data to inform discussions and determine the impact on students.

# <u>Example: Program Discontinuance Process - San Diego City College EEGE Program</u> Data Collection

The college began by analyzing enrollment, headcount, and awards data for the EEGE (Energy, Environment, and Green Engineering) Program within the School of Engineering & Technology.

- **72 unique students** enrolled in EEGE courses in 2022–23, accounting for **114 total enrollments** (some students took multiple courses).
- Majors in 2022–23:
  - o 7 in Energy Analysis and Consultation
  - 2 in Green Building Energy Professional
- Note, the process of students changing majors requires them to meet with counselors or make a petition for the change. Therefore, there may be students who have not yet officially changed their majors, which could influence the current distribution of majors within the program
- Review of Awards and Outcomes
  - o Note: EEGE is a new program, so completion data is limited.
  - 2022–23 Awards Conferred: 1 A.S. in Energy Analysis and Consultation; Certificate in Energy Analysis and Consultation; 1 Certificate in Green Building Energy Professional
