Both the California Education Code and Perkins V require every CTE program to maintain an active advisory committee. But these boards serve a much higher purpose beyond compliance, keeping education connected to the real world.

Advisory boards provide critical input on curriculum, facilities and emerging industry trends. Their expertise helps colleges ensure that what's being taught in classrooms and labs aligns with the current and future workforce, equipping students with relevant skills and ensuring businesses receive qualified, job-ready talent once they graduate.

Employers' firsthand knowledge of workforce demands, technologies and industry standards is vital to advisory committees to ensure programs stay current and competitive. By sharing insights on skill gaps, certifications and new tools, employers can directly shape curriculum updates that strengthen student success. Employers who serve on these committees can make a tangible difference not only by shaping the quality of programs but also by empowering students to build meaningful, sustainable careers.
